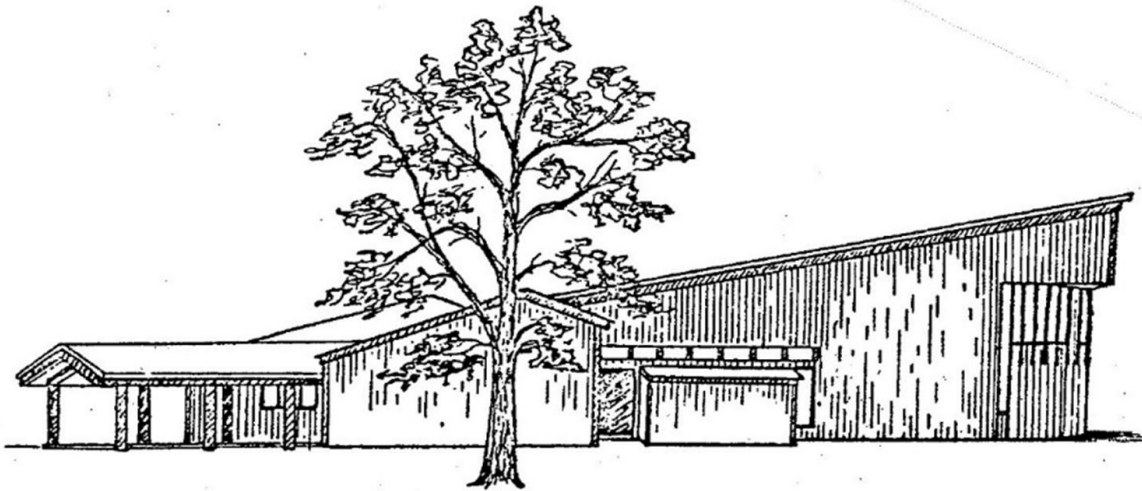

‘MISSION’ vs. ‘VISION’ –

The reasons that one changes while the other does not.

MISSION STATEMENT

The ‘mission statement’ defines the purpose and calling of the whole Christian Church on earth. The ‘mission’ of every Christian church on earth is the command from Jesus recorded in Matthew 28:18–20a, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. GO therefore and MAKE disciples of all nations, BAPTIZING them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and TEACHING them to observe all that I have commanded you.”



Christ Himself established the ‘mission’ of the Church that bears His name (the ‘Christian Church’), the ‘mission’ that also defines the life of every Christian.

Christ Himself established the ‘mission’ of the Church that bears His name (the ‘Christian Church’), the ‘mission’ that also defines the life of every Christian. Christians around the world recognize the words of the “Great Commission.” The words “Go ... make ... baptize ... teach” call Christians to lives of action. With these words, Jesus clearly defined the purpose for His Church and everyone on earth who follows Him and bear the name **Christian**.

God the Father is already ‘at work’ through His Holy Spirit planting the seeds of faith and nurturing them into branches that, while connected to the Vine (Jesus), will bear fruit (God-pleasing lives).

Before His ascension into heaven, Jesus said to the disciples, “You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be My witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.” (Acts 1:8)

The ‘mission statement’ **NEVER** changes.

Because Jesus Himself directed the purpose for the Church that bears His name, that ‘mission’ never changes. It is the guiding principle that we follow throughout our earthly life as His followers – as His disciples – in thought, word, and deed.

The ‘mission statement’ of the whole Christian Church on earth is clear, directive, and unchanging.

VISION STATEMENT ... A NEW ‘VISION’ FOR FAITH LUTHERAN ...

**“As we GROW in Christ’s Love and the Word,
we will SHARE Christ’s Love with the World.”**

A 'vision statement' focuses the local church and its membership on HOW the 'mission' of Christ's Church is to be lived in us and through us.

With every passing generation there are 'constants' and there are 'changes.' While values, morals, beliefs, and priorities change with every generation, the most comforting 'constant' for Christians is recorded in Hebrews 13:8, "Jesus Christ is the *SAME* yesterday and today and forever."

A 'vision statement' contains 'action' words that guide the life of followers of Jesus. (see the vision words above in all caps – "GROW" and "SHARE")

In addition to the "Great Commission" commands recorded in Matthew 28:18-20 (Go ... make ... baptize ... teach), the Bible contains other teachings that guide our daily life as we live the 'mission' of Christ's Church

The 'vision' to "GROW" and "SHARE" is based on Biblical teachings:

*Ephesians 2:19-22, "So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, **BUILT on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus Himself being the cornerstone**, in Whom the whole structure, being joined together, **GROWS** into a holy temple in the Lord. In Him **you also are being BUILT together** into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit."*

*Ephesians 4:15, "Speaking the truth in love, we are to **GROW up in every way** into Him Who is the head, into Christ."*

*2 Timothy 3:15-17, "How **from childhood** you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are **able to make you wise for salvation through faith** in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for **teaching**, for **reproof**, for **correction**, and for **training in righteousness**, that the man of God may be **complete, equipped** for every good work."*

*1 Peter 3:18, "But **GROW in the grace and knowledge** of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."*

*1 Peter 2:2, "Like newborn infants, **long for** the pure spiritual milk, that by it you may **GROW** up into salvation."*

*1 Peter 2:9, "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that **you may DECLARE the praises of Him** who called you out of darkness into His wonderful light."*

*1 Peter 3:15, "But in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, **always being PREPARED to make a defense** to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect."*

Other teachings from God's Word use descriptive words that give us God's clear expectations for our daily living towards others:

Galatians 5:22-23, 25, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such there is no law ... If we **LIVE by the Spirit**, let us also **keep in step with the Spirit.**"

Ephesians 4:15, "**SPEAKING the truth** in love, we are to **GROW UP in every way** into Him Who is the head (Christ)."

Colossians 3:12-17, "**PUT ON** then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, **FORGIVING** each other; **AS** the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. And above all these **PUT ON love**, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. **Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, TEACHING and ADMONISHING one another in all wisdom**, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And **whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, GIVING THANKS** to God the Father through Him."



A 'vision statement' changes as the needs and challenges of the local church and the surrounding community changes.

Churches annually review their ministries, their staff, their leaders, the direction that they are going, priorities, gospel outreach, loving our neighbors, etc.

'Vision Statements' must be easy to remember and absolutely clear in how we make it a part of our daily life as Christians.

Our NEW 'vision statement' at Faith Lutheran is both easy to remember and clear in God's expectations for us as Christians.

**"As we GROW in Christ's Love and the Word,

Many of the Bible verses quoted above teach us both “to grow” and “how to grow” as children of God and followers of Jesus.

Many of the Bible verses quoted above contain clear commands from Jesus “to share” the good news of the Gospel all of our life.

Brothers and sisters in Christ at Faith Lutheran Church and Preschool, let us commit to **GROWING** in the knowledge of the Word of God. This can be done through personal / daily devotions, Bible reading, regular worship, attendance in Bible classes, Sunday School, etc.

Brothers and sisters in Christ at Faith Lutheran Church and Preschool, let us commit to **SHARING** the knowledge we receive from growing in the Word of God about our Lord Jesus Christ. We learn so much in our life, but the challenge comes in HOW to SHARE what we have learned.

As your pastor, my best advice is to take ‘baby steps.’ Not many Christians hit the ground running with being missionaries for Christ. We need to celebrate the simple truths we have been taught and then slowly add to those truths what we mean by them and what more the Bible teaches us.

Finally, it's never too late to grow and it's never too late to share. All that will stand in your way is the unwillingness to do either or both. During every moment of struggle and inhibition, go in prayer to the Holy Spirit and remember the words of Jesus Who said at the end of the Great Commission passage, ***“Behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”***

“Birthday / Anniversary Fund”

Keeping our preschool competitive one offering at a time.

Faith Lutheran Preschool is our ‘front door’ to the larger mission field that exists in the homes of our community and the communities around us. The precious lambs entrusted to our care present us with daily, weekly, and monthly opportunities to teach them about Jesus and His love for them.

Our preschool began in September of 1984 under the faithful leadership of Linda Schroeder (Pastor's wife) and has been a blessing to many families over the past 41 years. Our preschool has been the ‘pride’ of many members – past and present – and has received special gifts and sacrificial offerings to support its unique ministry to families with young children.

Over the past four decades, our community and surrounding towns have seen a sharp and continual increase in the number of preschool and daycare providers. While some of them are ‘Christian’ in nature, not all of them provide what we can provide – an introduction to Jesus that may not be offered in each child’s home. What we offer the young children in our preschool can also become the missional ‘open door’ to introducing Jesus to their parents and siblings.

After months of careful thought and planning by the members of Faith Lutheran’s Board of Education, the decision was made to offer both ‘half-day’ AND ‘full-day’ preschool classes beginning with the 2025-2026 school year.

Yes, we will continue facing the challenges of competing with other preschools and daycare facilities around us, but we have an opportunity as a congregational family to reduce the amount of tuition so that we become the ‘best Christian option’ in the area.

This is where you – the family of Faith Lutheran Church – have an opportunity to prayerfully consider participating in an extra gesture of financial support for our preschool.

The creation of the “Birthday / Anniversary Fund” provides a necessary and crucial element to keeping our preschool tuition at the most affordable rate in the area each year. Families of Faith Lutheran Church are encouraged to pray about this opportunity to participate in a program that directly impacts the availability and affordability of our preschool **starting with the 2026-2027 school year.**

Our preschool already has a ‘Scholarship Fund’ that is designed to provide financial assistance to families with ‘demonstrated need.’ The **“Birthday / Anniversary Fund”** is entirely different and exists only to reduce the annual tuition for all families who consider enrolling their children in our preschool.

WHEN can we start contributing? You can start as early as Sunday, April 6.

HOW can you contribute to the “Birthday / Anniversary Fund”?

First, a separate fund with our bank will be set up that receives all the offerings that are received specifically for this program. The existence of a ‘special account’ ensures that these funds will not be siphoned away on ‘operational costs,’ but they are reserved for the specific purpose of reducing annual preschool tuition rates.

Sacrificial gifts to this fund can be directed through special envelopes as well as electronic giving. Directions for ‘electronic giving’ can be found on our Faith Lutheran website under the button titled “Give Now.” There are five tiles from which to choose – one of them is the “Birthday / Anniversary Fund” with options for you to choose how much and how often to make those transfers.

“Birthday / Anniversary Fund” envelopes will be made available on the table in the entryway for you to use to support this program. All you need to do is indicate on the envelope if your ‘thank offering’ is being given in honor of your birthday or anniversary **ALONG WITH** your envelope number as this would be considered by the IRS as a ‘charitable donation’ for tax purposes.

On the Sunday closest to the occasion of your birthday or the birthday of one of your children or your wedding anniversary, please make a ‘sacrificial’ offering to the preschool equal to the number of years of the birthday being celebrated or the number of years married.

Because of the intense and long-term level of planning regarding ways to sustain the viability of our preschool moving forward, this **“Birthday / Anniversary Fund”** is getting a later start in the year than we had hoped.

For individuals and couples of Faith Lutheran Church who would like to join in this form of financial support for our preschool but whose birthdays and / or wedding anniversaries have already occurred, please feel free to use an envelope on the table in the entryway or make your electronic offering for this calendar year.

Please prayerfully consider this opportunity that continues to make a positive impact on the long-term future of our preschool ministry. Thank you!!!

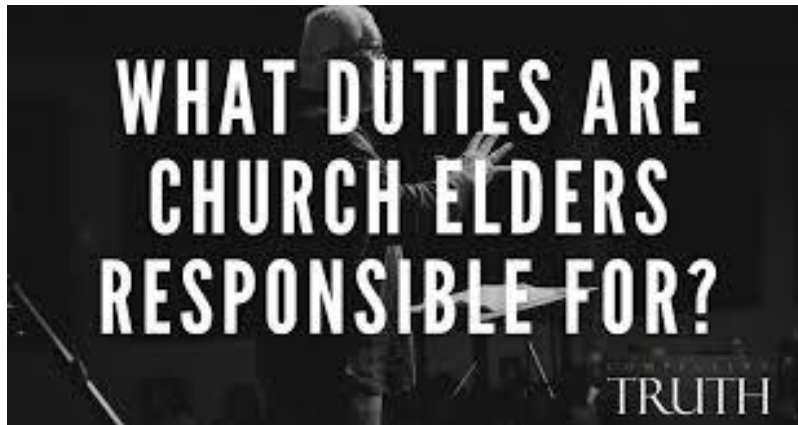

FROM THE BOARD OF ELDERS



Throughout the coming months, the Board of Elders will begin putting together a "Committee of Elder Assistants" to assist and support the current board members as they perform their assigned duties/responsibilities for Sunday morning services as well as other special services during the week. These committee members will be 'unelected' but 'qualified' male members of FLC who will learn to serve as "Elder-on- Duty" at occasional assigned services and perform the same 'regular responsibilities' of elected members of the board (unlock and prepare the building interior for the arrival of worshipers, ensure that there are ushers and an acolyte present to serve, that the sound system is turned on and set to record at the appropriate time, oversee and assist with the offerings if necessary, serve alongside Pastor as a distributor of the Lord's Supper, securing the tithes and offerings if counters are not present, and ensure that the building is appropriately checked before locking up after worship activities are completed and all participants have left.

These committee members may assist but are not elected officers and may not perform the following: contact ill and "lapsed" congregation members in the shepherding zones, ensure an active life of the congregation members in the shepherding zones, attend or participate in the monthly meetings, or other responsibilities as listed in the FLC constitution Bylaws Section VIII B).

Stewardship Essentials: Repetition

A seminary professor once quipped to a group of soon-to-be pastors just before Call Day: "Congratulations, brothers. You are about to graduate and become pastors. You will likely get two weeks of vacation your first year. This means that for 50 weeks in that year you will get to say the same thing, in new and creative ways."

Even though this professor was talking about proclaiming Jesus Christ and Him crucified for the forgiveness of sins every single Sunday, what he said also applies to the whole counsel of God, including Christian stewardship.

REPEAT



But this is the mistake so many pastors and steward leaders make every year. They relegate the teaching of stewardship to those weeks just before the creation of the congregational budget, or only begin teaching stewardship when the financial resources of the congregation are beginning to wear thin. This situation is the result of a truncated and impoverished view of stewardship. Instead, how should we teach stewardship?

STEWARDSHIP BEGINS IN OUR BAPTISMAL IDENTITY IN CHRIST

The identity of the Christian steward is far more complex than any giving chart or commitment card. When we relegate stewardship to time, talents and treasure, though these are neat compartments, they obscure a much larger truth. For both the individual and the congregation, the identity and vocation of the steward is at the very heart of the Gospel.

No pastor worth their salt would ever balk at reminding those entrusted to his care that they are baptized. From the structure and flow of the liturgy to preaching through the lectionary, the Divine Service is a weekly reminder that those gathered around Word and Sacrament are baptized.

This baptismal identity is not one God's people claimed for themselves. It is one that has been placed on them. The baptized have put on Christ. They are not their own. They have been bought with a price. The currency of that purchase is not gold or silver, but the holy, precious blood and innocent suffering and death of our Lord Jesus Christ!

REPEAT IT OFTEN: BE WHO CHRIST REDEEMED YOU TO BE

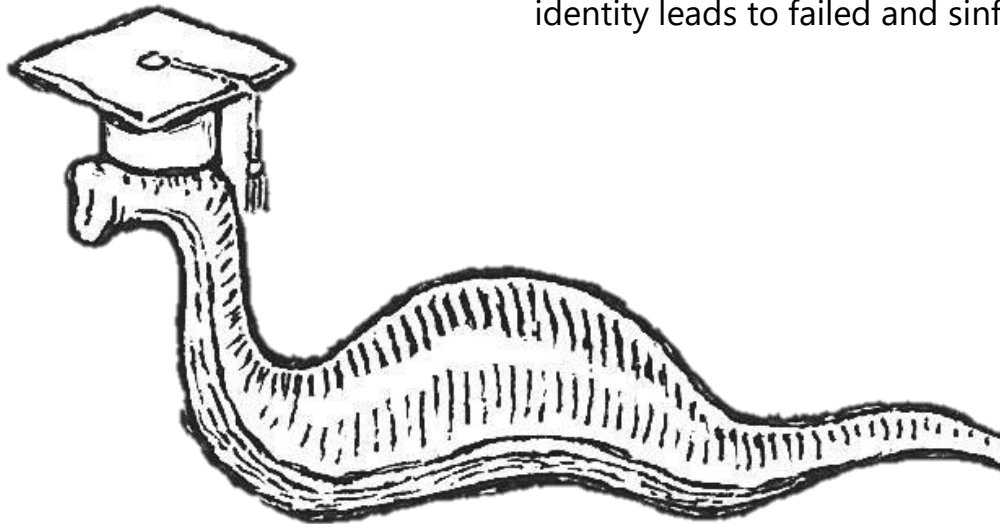
This is a message that is repeated in new and creative ways every week in orthodox Lutheran preaching and teaching.

This repetition is essential for two reasons. One, it is a call to repentance. Even the most faithful saint daily and often forgets that they do not belong to themselves. They claim ownership of what is really a trust from God. In the process, they are wallowing in idolatry that can and will separate them from the mercy of God revealed in Jesus Christ. Second, weekly repetition is necessary because it is often forgotten that what is lost and then restored by grace in one's baptismal identity is also a call to stewardship. Stewardship needs to be taught weekly since we forget it daily!

But this repetition is not about being the leech of Proverbs 30, demanding "Give, give" (Prov. 30:15). This weekly repetitive call to Christian stewardship is *be!*

Be who the Lord has made and redeemed you to be. This is a lesson that cannot be taught too much.

Is there a financial component to that? Of course there is! But it is so much more. Teaching stewardship as identity is the weekly call to serve the Lord by serving the neighbor. Because of sinful flesh that is turned in on itself, the sinner-steward often forgets their identity. Then, without fail, this forgotten identity leads to failed and sinful activity.



For this reason, the steward leader needs to strive for repetition in stewardship formation. The lectionary is a great tool in this. Every week, the assigned readings allow for, and even demand, a treatment from the perspective of the Christian steward. Managing all of life and life's resources for God's purposes is what the individual steward is called to do every day of their life. Repetition teaches this.

Steward leader: do not be afraid to be repetitive. Parents, teachers, and even God Himself repeat things so that the child, student and steward may learn. These lessons are learned by repeated exposure to the Gospel. This is done 52 weeks a year. And in the process stewards learn. They learn who they are. They learn what they are called to do. And they grow to the glory of God and the benefit of their neighbor.

LCMS Memory Verse Challenge

WHY MEMORIZE SCRIPTURE?

There are a multitude of reasons why we should hide God's Word in our mind and heart. Hiding God's Word in our heart is commanded (Colossians 3:16). Scripture Memory helps keep us from sin. It transforms our entire way of thinking. Scripture Memory helps us respond to difficulties in an appropriate manner. God uses Scripture to guide us. Memorization helps fuel meditation on God's Word. Scripture fills us with hope. Our Lord Jesus Christ serves as a great example for us in Scripture Memory.

"When Jonah was in the belly of the whale, it was too late to pull out his Bible. It was too late to grab his catechism and his hymnal. ... The great Song of Jonah in Chapter 2 is nothing but pieces of the psalms stitched together. They're his childhood memory verses and bedtime prayers that he was able to use in the total darkness of the whale to pray faithfully, to bring God's Word to bear on his situation, and to comfort himself in the midst of great distress.

"And that's exactly why we learn the Scriptures now: We never know when persecution may come, when technology or even access to Bibles and churches may go away.

Starting the first week of Easter, a "memory verse" will be added to our weekly announcements. The verses will be selected primarily from the Gospels and Epistles. Most of the selections will be short, just one or two verses at a time.
